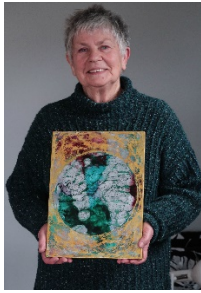


## SADHANA COOK



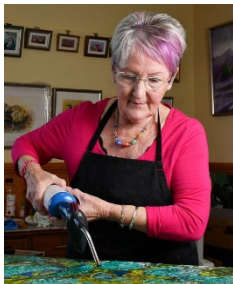

Her obsession with this fluid and serendipitous medium has led to some exciting experiences – not least of which was setting fire to her chair. She now has a fire extinguisher close at hand in her studio!

Sandra has won several awards and her work is in collections in many parts of the world. She has exhibited widely around Perth and Tasmania including five solo exhibitions. She has also been involved with tutoring workshops and demonstrating for art groups.

**MIXED MEDIA ARTIST:** Encaustic, collage, assemblage



*“For more than a decade I have combined my love of travel with foraging in European flea markets for antiques and vintage papers to use in my assemblages, collage and curiosity boxes. Then, in 2017 I discovered encaustics! The aroma and translucence of hot beeswax captivated me. It lends itself well to collage along with photo transfers, ink, colour pigments, watercolours and graphite. With various brush techniques a beguiling assortment of textures are achieved and I love that the medium continues to take me on a never-ending journey of discovery. I see the recent resurgence of encaustic as an exciting addition to the more traditional visual arts.”*

Since moving to the Huon Valley from Bali five years ago Lynne’s art has been viewed in many group exhibitions in Tasmania and in 2017 she held her first Hobart solo exhibition. She continues to run collage workshops and welcomes studio visits by appointment.
